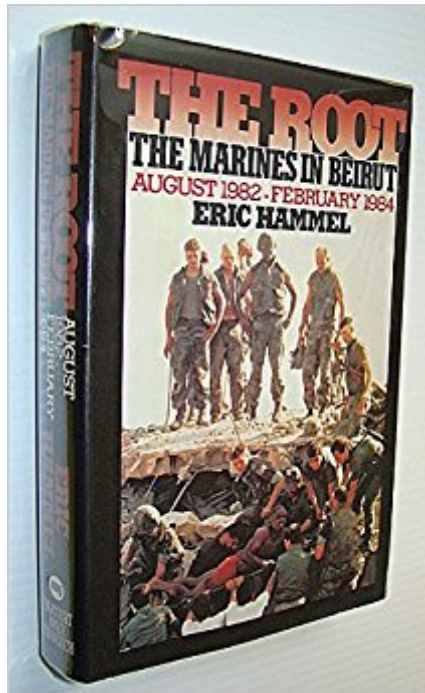




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The Root: The Marines In Beirut, August 1982-February 1984

Really quite good as I was researching this event for my own work... this is basically unknown today and it not taught about in high schools and colleges.
