

We are in the process of adopting a child from foster care, and bought this book for both sets of our parents. They have been excited for us, but a little overwhelmed and not quite sure how to "get their heads around" the issues, process and considerations. It was hard for us to know how much to share without scaring them. This book was perfect! My Dad said he read it in one sitting and it clarified a lot of generational differences in adoption for him. We also have a common base of knowledge and it has opened up some lines of discussion that we just didn't know how to broach before. I really recommend this for anyone adopting that wants to keep their family "positively excited but aware." :)

As a pre-adoptive parent, I bought this thinking I'd preview it before giving it to some family members. I found that I got a lot out of it myself! I think I will be a better support to other adoptive families, and be much more articulate with my extended family regarding our own adoption. I thought this was really well written and offered many viewpoints I hadn't considered.

Immediate family members are in the process of an international adoption and I was looking for some concrete suggestions from someone who has "been there, done that" with respect to ways to support them. This book was full of a lot of common sense ideas phrased in ways that I hadn't previously thought of. There were some great suggestions on how to support a family member or friend going through the adoption process. It also is beneficial to validate some feelings expressed by our family. Lastly, I really liked the list of additional resources available at the back of the book for more specific info pertaining to individual circumstances. This book is being passed around to our other family members.

This book presents several different perspectives, and offers families real advice (allow time to grieve just like the adoptive parents may have, specific questions to ask to be involved, and pragmatic info about different adoption processes).
