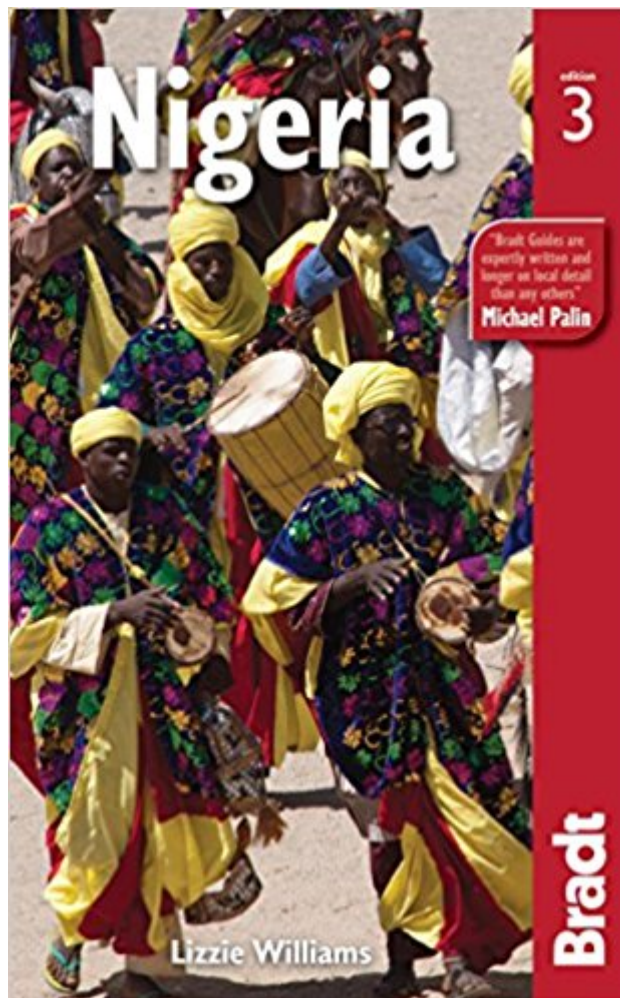

Also, this seems a bit out of date. Brandt might not be too interested in updating it due to the civil unrest in the north of Nigeria. Overall, I would say that Nigeria is a lovely country full of really wonderful people and I'm glad I went!

Bradt's Travel Guide Nigeria is the best. Really, I've been in and out Nigeria since 2000--working in Abuja the capital for 2 yrs--and on business.
