

Gr 4-7 •Another magical tale that emphasizes every person's unique gifts. Some years have passed in the Beaumont household, in which each family member has a "savvy," or magical ability that manifests itself around age 13. Now it is Gypsy's turn, but her savvy for seeing

flashes of the past and future causes her more anxiety than happiness. A vision of her Grandma Pat falling off a clock tower terrifies her, and she determines to prevent it. Worse yet, the curmudgeonly woman has Alzheimer's and will come live with the Beaumonts. This dreaded event has switched everyone's gifts. Gypsy now stops time, her brother Tucker can grow, brother Samson can start fires, and their perfect mother now is clumsy and accident prone. Navigating the new reality, saving Grandma, and accepting her savvy are on Gypsy's to-do list. Law's signature writing style is evident in her third story; whimsical word patterns dance around her savvy characters. Gypsy and her family seem to be in constant, unusual motion, rather like a Willy Wonka elevator. And, much like authors Deborah Wiles or Patricia Reilly Giff, Law contrasts warm family support with personal despair and hardship, nicely balancing her dramatic action with stability and optimism. Gypsy's family will always love her, even if she sends a car into the river (oops). There are a few coincidences and a tidy ending, but overall, Law has again told a story with as much heart as creativity. Not as good as the first two. Starts slow. Everything has been explained all over again - again. When writing a series, subsequent books should not be explained like a first book. Do a synopsis at the beginning to summarize what needs to be remembered, and then move forward. If someone hasn't read the previous book(s), then they shouldn't be reading the current one (including children!). The story actually gets rolling about halfway through. Between the "switch" and certain natural laws pertaining thereto, it seems like a cheap grab for a sequel. Gypsy is so resentful she's hard to like or even sympathize. Many bad decisions that can't necessarily be explained by "resentful, panicking teenager." Bottom line: OK ... 3-1/2 stars

I loved this new edition of the series featuring Gypsy. Where Ledger Kale of Scumble was all fumble, hormones and savvy driven infatuation Gypsy was really refreshing. She was a strong lead struggling with giant problems. On one hand she wanted to fit in and be considered grown up, on the other hand she was struggling to come to terms with a cranky grandmother in an impossible situation. Finally she became more "grown up" than the friend who had spurned her could hope to be for many years to come. Gypsy was an admirable character full of determination and wonder, she fought with the need to prove herself to others and came out on top- something Ledger never did. I would recommend this book to anyone who found the first book amazing, even if you found the second (as I did) kind of a weak follow up. Switch comes back strong and was all the more enjoyable for the contrast.

A great final book to a wonderful series! I loved learning about Gypsy Beaumont, and had a great time reading about the crazy adventure she and her brothers went on. Ingrid Law did not disappoint in this exciting final book, the last in the Savvy series. If you liked this book as much as I did, try reading Drizzle by Kathleen Van Cleve.
