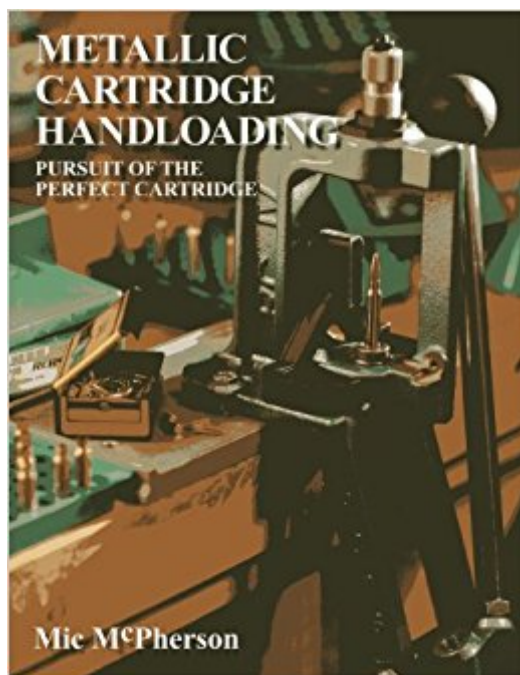

Mic McPherson has written one of those books you only see once every so many decades; it literally contains everything that you need to know about reloading a rifle or handgun cartridge from A through Z. It covers all aspects of the reloading process: the cartridge case; maintaining, improving and loading the case; the seating and reading of primers; the loading of propellant; bullets and the loading of bullets; accurate load development; internal & external ballistics; bullet making & casting; and the handloading press. No book that we are aware of has ever explained so thoroughly and in this much detail (with hundreds of photos and drawings) how the process of reloading works, from an empty case to a fully loaded cartridge with bullet, powder, and primer properly in place to give maximum performance and accuracy. If you are serious about reloading your ammo and you want to get the most from it, you owe it to yourself to get this book.

Mic McPherson was the editor to the bestselling book, *Cartridges Around the World*. The author resides in Colorado.

This should be 6 stars or more, since 5 stars usually means that a product is adequate in every aspect. Jam packed with photographs, illustrations, charts and clearly written text, this book stands head and shoulders above all the other handloading books I have on my shelf - and I have quite a collection of notable titles and authors. Mr. McPherson will lead you into every aspect of handloading and give you answers to questions you never thought to pose! This is not a recipe book - it's an exhaustive (but easy to read) guide of what to do once you have those recipes. Do

you want to know which powders meter best, and why? Are there better powders for shorter or longer barrels? Which primers create significantly higher pressures than others? What specialty tools make your reloading safer and aid in more accurate loads? It's all there, even with charts on what powder is which type - flake, ball, cylinder, etc. And then there is information on cartridges, bullets, bullet casting... much more. I've been handloading for more than 12 years and studying as much as time permits. I am amazed at all the new information this book has shown me about this enjoyable hobby.

This is a book intended for people who have been reloading for a while. The book contains very detailed information about reloading. It covers most aspects although making subsonic rounds could have been covered a bit better. McPherson concentrates mostly on loading precision ammo but he pays a lot of attention to improving the functionality of ammunition as well. So I believe this book is a good buy for IPSC shooters too. This is a book I have been waiting for to fill the gap of information left after reading a couple comprehensive reloading manuals. Reading this book really helps me understand what I'm actually doing while loading.

This is the finest book on handloading I've read in the past 35 years. Mr. McPherson more than covers the basics of reloading the metallic cartridge case and goes into detail on many aspects not covered by other authors in other reloading books. His explanations of case design and what takes place from the primer's ignition to the bullet's exit is outstanding. Mic emphasizes safety throughout the book as it pertains to the various stages of reloading and also warns of the potential dangers of haphazardly changing components from that of published load data. The handloader is well served with this book and it belongs on the shelf next to one's assortment of current reloading manuals.
