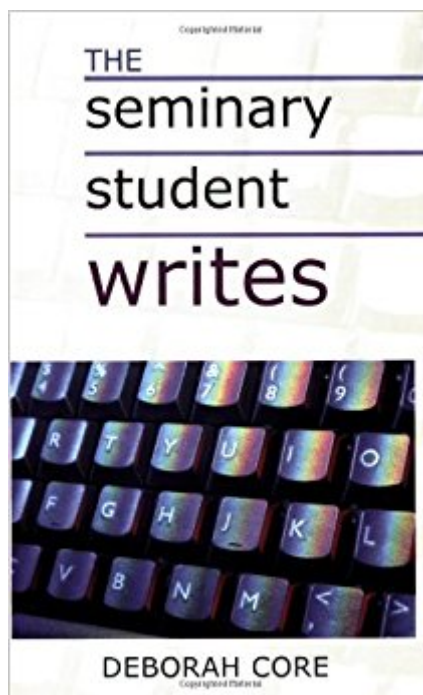

Synopsis

Deborah Core offers practical guidance for beginning seminary students who feel overwhelmed and under-prepared to write the number and quality of papers their courses require. It is not very much about writing about the things of God at all, and seems to be aimed instead at people who are preparing to enter into college writing for the first time.
