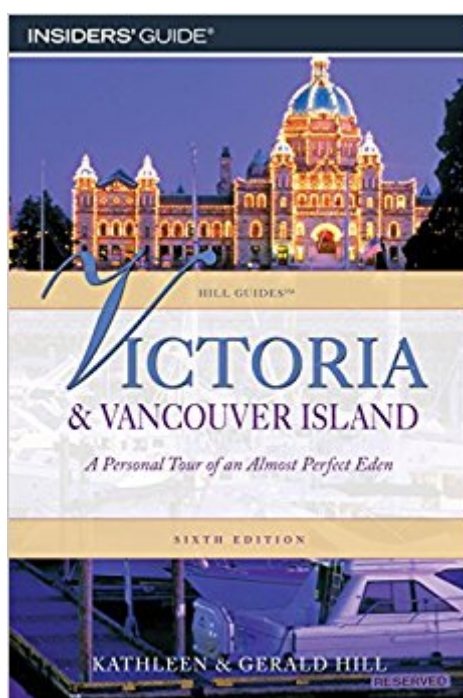

The authors are enthusiastic about Victoria and Vancouver Island (as they should be) and they write in a witty and engaging fashion; I fail to see how that translates into anything objectionable.
