I read the first two of this Christian Science Fiction series (the Seventh World Trilogy) for free and this one I actually had to buy. Me being a cheapskate should tell you that I thought it would be worth

the price--and it was. If you read the two previous reviews of the two previous books (or read the books) (Worlds Unseen and Burning Light), you will remember some of the characters were gifted. Maggie was gifted with songs that foretold, comforted, and healed; Virginia was blind most of the time but had extraordinary visions; the Ploughman had the gift of being able to call on angelic warriors when needed; Miracle could bring healing even to the worst wounded; Nicolas, the one with the fire eyes; and Kieran, the boy in whose footsteps plants grew. The prophesy said when the six were woven together something great would happen. The six were scattered from here to yonder, some captured by the evil ones and in danger of life and limb. The Blackness sought to capture all of them and grab their power. Talking about being woven together, this book is something else. You need to grab it and read, read, read. Some truly inspired writing here!

I really enjoyed this 3rd book in the trilogy. It is well written - there's plenty of action as well as character depth. I enjoyed seeing how the characters had grown and changed since the first book. I enjoyed the build up of the possibility of the return of the King and the battle between good and evil. Very insightful at times. Rachel is a good story teller. However, the end of chapter 19 made no sense to me. The next 2 chapters didn't seem to fit with the story at all. It was almost like someone advised the author to add a "moral to the story" or something so she added these last couple of chapters. It killed it for me - the positive energy of the book, the lessons learned in the battle, all of the good stuff just died with those last 2-3 chapters. Why? Why couldn't you leave it where it was? You didn't need to neatly tie up all the loose ends and close the story on a troubled note. Leaving it open ended would allow you to go back and write more in this series in the future (if you wished). There's definitely enough material there - you could even go back and write a prequel. Anyway, I enjoyed it but the ending was a downer for me. Be forewarned.

Age group: 13+ For scary situations, and mild violence After finished Burning Light, I started Coming Day as soon as I could. I really, really wanted to know what was going to happen to all the

characters I had come to love, as well as see the end of this epic fantasy trilogy. It was nothing, absolutely nothing like I expected. It was far better. This story opens at a very low point. The hope and the energy that the last two books have built on has waned. People are discouraged and weary, a feeling that touched me deeply, because I have been there. I have been at a point where I wondered if anything good would ever happen again. Rachel was able to pull on my emotions and make me feel what the characters were feeling. As I said before, Rachel's writing style is nothing short of lyrical. I reread many portions and read some of them aloud, just because they sounded amazing. I can see this as a wonderful book to read aloud as a family. The most exciting part of this book was that you see all the threads you have been following pulling together. All the stories are pulling together, and so are *The Gifted*. The bad guys, as in the first two books, were pretty dark. There were also several intense parts, but I still really enjoyed the book a lot. The ending was nothing like what I expected it to be. It was so much better. Rachel again showed herself in the top tier of writers for her imaginative story-telling that took this allegory beyond the norm. I recommend this book for those who loved the first two, love fantasy, adventure, and allegories.

Ms. Thomson's writing is excellent; she tells a story well, and her characters are quite interesting. I felt that the ending of this series was weak, however. Without revealing any "spoilers" I felt we were building to a great, powerful climax of "good over evil" but was disappointed in the turn it took. It felt like a forced ending to make things "allegorical." Otherwise, the book was a good read, as were the first two in the series.

I reviewed the first book in this trilogy and wished for a few things throughout the rest of the series. I was not disappointed. The story and writing were just what I had hoped for. The plot was well-written, characters engaging, truths alluded to, and the reading was enjoyable. I highly recommend you read this trilogy! I have to be honest: I did not read the second book. Somehow, I got things switched around in my mind. I had purchased & downloaded both book 2 and 3 at the same time. When I got around to picking up the 'second' book of the trilogy, I accidentally started this one. Things were a little disjointed for me at first, since I missed all the events and characters in book 2. I thought it was due to being so busy around the holidays and only being able to grab very short bits of reading spaced out over numerous days. About halfway through, I was really caught up and swept through to the end. But I wondered, "where could the third book possibly go? This title seemed to wrap everything up." And then... the discovery of my mistake! I don't think I'll read the second, since it will probably just be a build-up of tension and events, for which I already know the
