

The Congruent Apprentice was an interesting story. No, it didn't break new grounds in fantasy or the coming of age genres. What was usual was that the main character was a well-mannered, respectful young man who strived to work in harmony with others. It is unusual in today's look-at-me culture and a good respite from today's culture. The author set a slow and steady pace as we learned more about the world setting, the conflicts between kingdoms, and the magic system. What I didn't enjoy was the rush at the end to toss out key revelations to set up the next book. Also, it ended on a cliffhanger, which can be annoying to many readers. Otherwise, the book was well polished and a highly enjoyable read.
